done virtually nothing to cause the climate crisis.

Nonetheless, they are the ones whose livelihoods are now threatened by rising sea levels, while industrialized countries and Western companies – those primarily responsible for climate change – continue to shy away from commitment to real solutions. In order to change this, four residents of Pari took legal action against the world's largest cement corporation Holcim in Switzerland. 


